WEDNESDAY DECEMBER 28, 1994
EXPORT DEMAND HAS DROPPED OFF FOR WHEAT SO FAR THIS WEEK AND SIGNS OF LIGHT PROFIT TAKING WAS REFLECTED IN LOWER WHEAT PRICES. CORN PRICES WERE MIXED BUT SHOWED SOME STRENGTH ON NEWS OF CHINA'S OVERNIGHT PURCHASE AND THE HIGHER WEEKLY EXPORT INSPECTION NUMBERS. MODERATE DECLINES IN SOYBEAN PRICES WERE DUE TO PROFIT TAKING ON THE BOARD AND INCREASED FARMER SELLING. WHEAT 2 TO 8 CENTS LOWER. CORN MIXED. SORGHUM 1 TO 2 CENTS HIGHER EXCEPT GULF RAIL DOWN 4 CENTS. SOYBEANS 2 TO 5 CENTS LOWER. LOWER

EXPORT SALES HAVE PRESSURED WHEAT PRICES BUT INDICATIONS THAT CHINA NEEDS ADDITIONAL WHEAT LIMITED DECLINES. WINTER WHEAT IS REPORTED IN GOOD CONDITION AND FAVORABLE GROWING WEATHER IS A FACTOR IN FALLING WHEAT PRICES. OVERSEAS CORN SALES HAVE BEEN GOOD THE PAST COUPLE OF WEEKS AND CHINA'S REPORTED SALE OVERNIGHT GAVE PRICES A BOOST. SOME FUND BUYING TOOK PLACE AND TUESDAY'S STRONG WEEKLY EXPORT INSPECTION FIGURES FOR CORN ADDED TO THE UPWARD TREND. CORN AND SOYBEAN PRICES RECEIVED SOME PRESSURE AS COUNTRY SELLING INCREASED DUE TO THE RECENT CLIMB IN PRICES AND FARMERS ARE IN NEED OF YEAR END TAX MONEY. SOYBEAN MEAL PRICES FELL SLIGHTLY WHICH ALSO PUT PRESSURE ON BEANS HOWEVER, CHINA'S OVERNIGHT SOY OIL PURCHASE LIMITED DECLINES.
