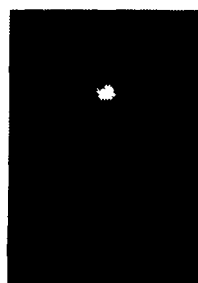
## Larry Medaglia

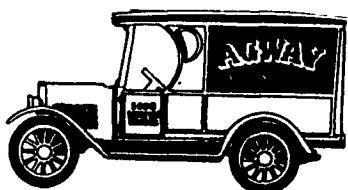

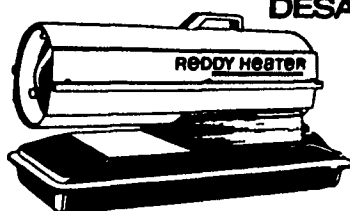
