MARKET COMMENT: MARKET TONE WAS BARELY STEADY TO WEAK. DEMAND WAS IRREGULAR, BEST INTO RETAIL FEATURES AND FIRST OF THE MONTH BUSINESS. SUPPLIES OF WHITE EGGS WERE AT LEAST ADEQUATE AND AVAILABLE, AND BROWN EGG SUPPLIES IN NEW ENGLAND WERE MOSTLY ADEQUATE. BREAKING STOCK SUPPLIES WERE AT LEAST ADEQUATE, AND MOST PLANTS RESTRICTED PURCHASES TO REGULAR COMMITMENTS. A EXTRA LARGE .66-.71, A LARGE .64-.69, A MEDIUM .54-.58.

GRAIN AND SOYBEAN PRICES EXTENDED LAST FRIDAY'S LOSSES MOVING INTO A NEW YEAR AS FUND SELLING CREATED PRESSURE IN THE PITS. WHEAT 2 TO 7 CENTS LOWER.

CORN 2 TO 3 CENTS LOWER. SORGHUM 1 TO 9 CENTS LOWER. SOYBEANS 2 TO 3 CENTS LOWER. PROFIT TAKING ON THE BOARD FORCED WHEAT PRICES MODERATELY LOWER. DESPITE THE GOOD EXPORT SALES ANNOUNCED THIS MORNING, TRADERS ARE CONCERNED OVER THE LOWER WHEAT SALES TO CHINA. SLIGHT DECLINES IN CORN AND SOYBEAN PRICES WERE ALSO DUE TO FUND SELLING ON THE BOARD INFLUENCED BY THE LACK OF NEW EXPORT DEMAND AND INCREASED FARMER SELLING. CONTINUED FAVORABLE WEATHER IN SOUTH AMERICA WAS ALSO NEGATIVE TO BEAN PRICES. THE FIRMER BEAN MEAL MARKET, HOWEVER, LIMITED DECLINES. GRAINS INSPECTED FOR EXPORT FOR WEEK ENDED 12/29/94: WHEAT TOTALED 17.8 MILLION BUSHELLS DOWN 11.9, CORN 37.5 DOWN 14.0, SORGHUM 2.0 DOWN 5.6, AND SOYBEANS 17.6 UP 3.0 MILLION BUSHELLS COMPARED TO A WEEK AGO. YEAR TO DATE: WHEAT 687.6 DOWN 39.8, CORN 635.6 UP 74.7, SORGHUM 70.8 UP 20.6, AND SOYBEANS 313.5 UP 63.5.
