POPCORN GRANOLA MUNCH

- 8 cups popped corn 1 cup wheat germ 1/2 cup shredded coconut
- 1 cup rolled oats 1/2 cup sesame seeds 1/2 cup creamy peanut
- 1 tablespoon water
- 1 tablespoon oil 1/2 cup
- molasses 2 tablespoons honey

n a large mixing bowl combine popped corn, wheat germ, coconut, rolled oats, and sesame seeds. Heat peanut butter, water, oil, molasses, and honey in a saucepan. Pour the heated mixture over the popcorn mix and stir well. Spread on a greased haking sheet
