Live supplies were generally moderate; weights were mostly desirable to heavy. Processing schedules remained very heavy. Several plants plan to close on

the upcoming Monday holiday. Less than trucklot asking prices were 1 cent lower at 48 to 59 cents. Trade sentiment varied from steady to weak. Bone-in breasts were in short supply. Boneless skinless breasts were fully adequate. Wings were balanced to well cleared. Leg quarters were adequate.

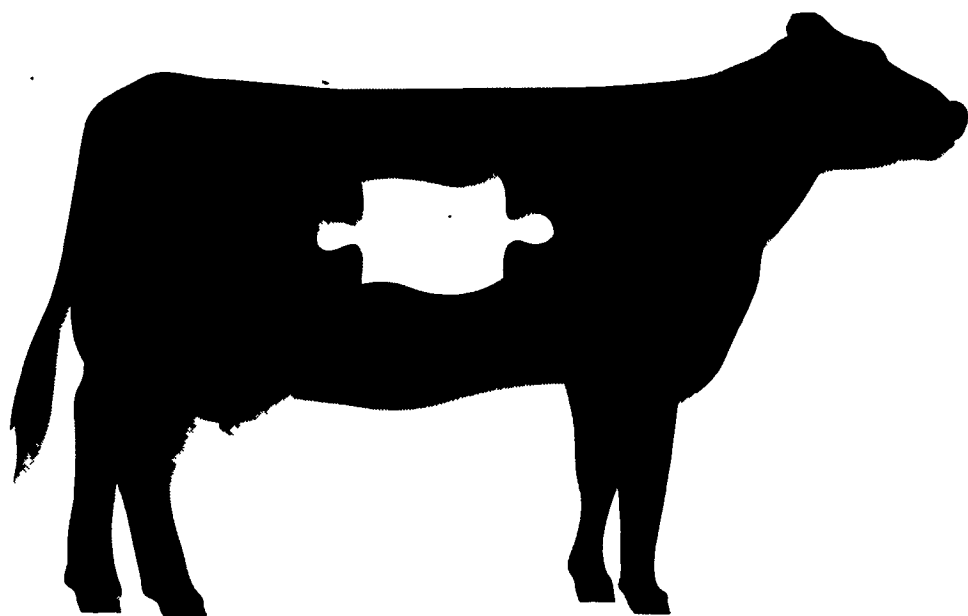
