The Original Dixieland Jaz Band opened in New York City on January 17, 1917. They were the first group to use the strange word that no one knew how to spell. Advertisements for the band's first record, released in March that year, called it "jass," as did many of the newspapers reporting on the musical form. Although the unique new sound swept the country, some folks felt it would corrupt young people. In 1918, the New Orleans *Times-Picayune* called it "a musical vice" and urged the city to "be the last to accept the atrocity in polite society and make it a point of civic honor to suppress it."



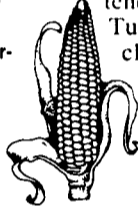

CHEESY CORN CREOLE

- 2 slices bacon
- 2 tablespoons vegetable oil
- 1/2 cup chopped green pepper
- 1 large onion, chopped
- 2 cups canned tomatoes, drained
- 1 teaspoon sugar
- 1/2 teaspoon salt
- 1/8 teaspoon black pepper
- 1/8 teaspoon cayenne pepper
- 2 cups frozen corn kernels, thawed and drained
- 1 1/2 cups shredded Cheddar cheese



Cook bacon until crisp drain and set aside. Discard fat. Heat oil in a large skillet, sauté pepper and onion until soft about 5 minutes. Add tomatoes and sugar cook 10 minutes stirring occasionally. Add salt, peppers and corn, cook until tender, about 5 minutes. Turn off heat, sprinkle cheese and crumble bacon over the corn. Cover just long enough to melt cheese.

Makes 8 servings.

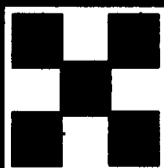
