SCOTTSDALE, Ariz. — The Lancaster County Conservation District, represented by Aaron Stauffer of Ephrata, Pa., has been honored as a grand award District in the 47th annual Conservation Awards Program sponsored by The Goodyear Tire & Rubber Company and National Association of Conservation Districts. (NACD).

Stauffer represented the district during a work/study program for award winners Dec. 1-4 at the Camelback Inn Resort here.

Since 1947, the Goodyear/NACD Conservation Awards Program has encouraged and rewarded local efforts to protect and conserve soil, water, forests, wildlife and other natural resources. Winning districts are selected on the basis of their success in developing and implementing an annual plan for delivering district programs and services.

"The success of conservation districts is vital to the protection of our country's natural resources," said Goodyear's David Fulton, director of the conservation awards program. "This program assists

local districts in their efforts to serve the community and recognizes those that have done an outstanding job of delivering quality conservation programs and services."

Lancaster County was one of 57 local conservation districts chosen as grand award winners based on their achievements during 1993. Nearly 3,000 soil and water conservation districts nationwide were eligible for the award.

In addition to observing conservation and agricultural practices in the Scottsdale area, Stauffer and participants in the work/study trip had an opportunity to discuss major conservation issues and policies with Jerry Digerness, president of NACD.

"Lancaster County and every conservation district in the country have benefited from their participation in the Goodyear/NACD conservation Awards Program," Digerness said. "Not only does better program management and planning help the district, but everyone in the community reaps the benefits of more efficient and innovative district programs."
