SUBSTANTIAL PURCHASES OVERNIGHT FAILED TO KEEP WHEAT PRICES AFLOAT AS MOST TRADERS FELT SALES HAD BEEN FACTORED IN EARLIER. EXPORT OUTLOOK APPEARS DULL AND INDICATIONS CHINA, RUSSIA AND EGYPT WILL BE TAKING A BREATHER, WEAKENED WHEAT PRICES. CORN AND SOYBEAN PRICES FELL SLIGHTLY FROM PRO-FIT TAKING AND SPILLOVER WEAK-NESS IN WHEAT PITS. FARMER SELLING OF CORN SEEMS TO HAVE INCREASED OVER THE PAST COU-PLE OF DAYS. EXPORT DEMAND CONTINUED NIL FOR CORN AND BEANS, WHICH ADDED TO THE DECLINE IN PRICES. FAVORABLE WEATHER IN SOUTH AMERICA PUT FURTHER PRESSURE ON U.S. SOY-BEAN PRICES.




