County extension agent; Joseph Colangelo, Pennsylvania Department of Agriculture, and Brenda Briggs, Pennsylvania Apple Marketing Program.

The meeting will provide recertification credits for private applicators of restricted use pesticides if the necessary forms are com-

pleted before the meeting.
