Processing schedules were very heavy. Less than trucklot asking prices were unchanged at 47 to 58 cents. Trade sentiment was mostly steady, instances weak. In the parts complex, bone-in breasts were in good balance to well cleared. Supplies of boneless skinless breasts continued to tighten. Leg items were fully adequate. Wings were burdensome.
