CORN PITS THIS WEEK. THE SLIGHT WEAKNESS HAS BEEN NO SURPRISE DUE TO THIS YEAR'S RECORD CROP. MINNEAPOLIS REPORTED NO BID FOR CORN OR SOYBEANS TODAY AS STORAGE FACILITIES ARE FLOWING OVER AND RAIL CARS ARE SCARCE. THE SOUTH KOREAN CORN PURCHASE PUT A LITTLE STRENGTH BACK INTO CORN PRICES BUT MORE FOREIGN SALES ARE NEEDED TO REALLY PERK UP PRICES.
