CORRECTIONS WERE MADE IN WHEAT PITS, TODAY, AS LIGHT PROFIT TAKING SHAVED A PORTION OFF THIS WEEK'S GAINS. CORN AND SOYBEAN PRICES WERE FINISHED THE DAY MIXED. WHEAT 1 TO 4 CENTS LOWER. CORN MIXED. SORGHUM 2 TO 4 CENTS LOWER. SOYBEANS MIXED. WINTER WHEAT CROP IS REPORTED IN GOOD CONDITION WITH RECENT SNOWFALL GIVING PROTECTION TO WHEAT. RECENT PRICE ADVANCES WERE TRIMMED BY LIGHT PROFIT TAKING ON THE BOARD, DESPITE THE EXCELLENT EXPORT SALES SO FAR THIS WEEK. CHINA IS EXPECTED TO TENDER SOON FOR ADDITIONAL WHEAT, LIMITING PRICE DECLINES. VERY LITTLE HAS HAPPENED IN

CORN PITS THIS WEEK. THE SLIGHT WEAKNESS HAS BEEN NO SURPRISE DUE TO THIS YEAR'S RECORD CROP. MINNEAPOLIS REPORTED NO BID FOR CORN OR SOYBEANS TODAY AS STORAGE FACILITIES ARE FLOWING OVER AND RAIL CARS ARE SCARCE. THE SOUTH KOREAN CORN PURCHASE PUT A LITTLE STRENGTH BACK INTO CORN PRICES BUT MORE FOREIGN SALES ARE NEEDED TO REALLY PERK UP PRICES. SOUTH AMERICAN WEATHER CONTINUED FAVORABLE, IMPROVING THE PROBABILITY FOR GOOD BEAN YIELDS THIS YEAR. SOYBEAN MEAL AND OIL PRICES DECLINED TODAY AND THE LACK OF EXPORT INTEREST THIS WEEK, PRESSURED PRICES.
