Demand was seasonally slow to instances moderate. Supplies were adequate to ample for the large sizes, and mediums were usually adequate. Breaking stock supplies were adequate to fully adequate for the regularly committed needs, and plants ran full schedules. Light type hens were at least adequate for the light demand, and the market tone remained steady.

 Movement of ready-to-cook whole birds was light to fair and generally below expectations.

Offerings varied from fully adequate to ample. Live supplies were moderate; weights were in a full range of light to heavy. Slaughter schedules were very heavy. Less than trucklot asking prices were unchanged at 47 to 58 and scellers often removed premiums to stimulate movement. Trade sentiment was barely steady. In the parts complex, bone-in breasts were adequate to short. Boneless skinless breast were fully adequate at most plants. Leg quarters were in good overall balance. Legs and drums were fully adequate. Wings were ample.
