PROFIT TAKING ON THE BOARD PUSHED EXPORT SUPPORT OUT THE WINDOW AND WHEAT PRICES DECLINED.

IMPROVED EXPORT INTEREST FIRMED CORN PRICES. SOYBEAN PRICES WEAKENED DUE TO CONTINUED SOUTH AMERICAN CROP PRESSURE AND LACK OF NEW FOREIGN DEMAND WHEAT 1 TO 5 CENTS LOWER CORN 1 TO 7 CENTS HIGHER. SORGHUM 1 TO 7 CENTS HIGHER. SOYBEANS 1 TO 6 CENTS LOWER. GOOD EXPORT DEMAND HAS BEEN THE MAJOR SUPPORT PROVIDER FOR WHEAT PRICES OVER THE PAST FEW WEEKS AND OVERNIGHT SALES TO THE PHILIPPINES OFFERED SOME EARLY STRENGTH HOWEVER, GAINS WERE INTERRUPTED BY ACTIVE PROFIT TAKING, AND WHEAT PRICES WERE UNDERMINED CORRECTIONS WERE MADE IN CORN PITS AS RECENT DECLINES WERE

SEEN AS OVERDONE. EXPORT DEMAND PICKED UP SLIGHTLY OVERNIGHT, ADDING LIGHT SUPPORT TO CORN PRICES. EXPECTATIONS FOR A LARGE SOUTH AMERICAN SOYBEAN CROP CONTINUED TO DEPRESS U.S. BEAN PRICES. SOY-OIL DEMAND LOOKS BAD AND MEAL PRICES HAVE BEEN STRUGGLING BUT PRICES SLIPPED LOWER. EXPORT BEAN SALES ARE SUBSTANTIALLY LOW COMPARED TO LAST YEAR.
