He guided Mr. Boyce to his destination and refused a tip for his efforts, explaining that he was a Scout. On finishing his errand, Boyce asked the boy to take him to the British Scouting office, where he met Lord Robert Baden-Powell, the founder of Scouting. Boyce was impressed by what he learned in England and resolved

to bring Scouting home to America. On February 8, 1910, Boyce and three other men founded the Boy Scouts of America, but it really all started with one boy doing a good turn.



TIP OF THE WEEK

Out of baking chocolate? Substitute 3 tablespoons unsweetened cocoa and 1 tablespoon shortening for each 1-ounce square of baking chocolate.

SOUR CREAM FUDGE

2 squares baking chocolate 2/3 cup sour cream 2 cups sugar 1/2 teaspoon vanilla



In heavy saucepan, melt chocolate over very low heat. Add sour cream and sugar and cook to soft-ball stage (230° F). Remove from heat, add vanilla, and cool. Pour onto platter. Sprinkle with a little salt and work with a spatula back and forth until fudge forms a ball. Roll out to 1/2-inch thickness on a buttered cookie sheet. Let stand until hardened then cut into squares

Makes 1/4 pound.


