sistently pays above the Federal Order 2 price.

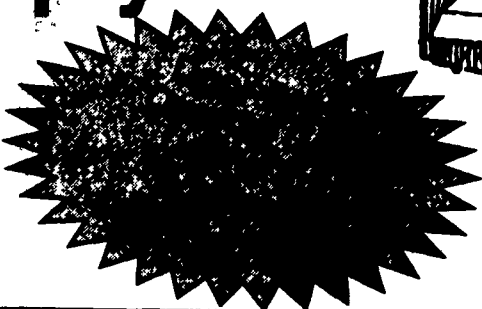

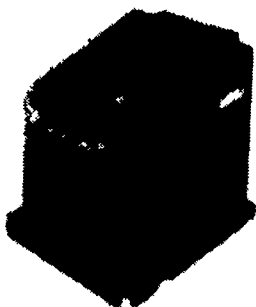

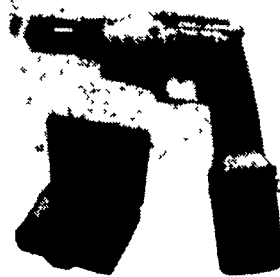
