EXPORT DEMAND, GOOD AND BAD, INFLUENCED GRAIN AND SOYBEAN PRICES WITH WHEAT PRICES LOWER, CORN AND BEAN PRICES HIGHER. WHEAT UNCHANGED TO 5 CENTS LOWER. CORN UNCHANGED TO 1 CENT HIGHER. SORGHUM MIXED. SOYBEANS 2 TO 5 CENTS HIGHER. WHEAT PRICES FAILED TO REACT POSITIVELY TO NEWS OF CHINA'S WHEAT TENDER AS TRADERS FELT THAT DESPITE THE FINAL ACTION, IT'S OLD NEWS. OTHER EXPORT BUS-INESS HAS BEEN SLOW THIS WEEK. COLD TEMPERATURES IN THE PLAINS AND MIDWEST AREAS THIS WEEK NOT A MAJOR CONCERN AT THIS TIME. CORN PRICES HELD ON AFTER YESTERDAY'S SLIGHT DROP, FIRING DUE TO NEWS THAT PORTUGAL WAS EXPECTED TO TENDER FOR 250,000 TONNES OF U.S. CORN TONIGHT AND TAIWAN COULD BE IN THE MARKET BY THE END OF THE WEEK. INDICATIONS SOUTH AFRICA'S MAZE CROP MAY FAIL TO MEET ITS DOMESTIC DEMAND THIS YEAR OFFERED ADDITIONAL EXPORT OPTIMISM. LATE FUND BUYING ON THE BOARD DUE TO TAIWAN'S SUBSTANTIAL EXPORT PURCHASE PUSHED SOYBEAN PRICES UPWARD AMID CONTINUED CONCERNS OVER UPCOMING SOUTH AMERICAN HARVEST.
