

#### SPILT MILK?

n 1930 there were 21.9 million cows in the United States. Collectively they produced 116.6 billion pounds of milk. One of those cows, a Guernsey from Missouri, contributed part of that milk under rather unusual circumstances. On February 18, 1930, the brave cow boarded a plane at the St. Louis International Air Exposition. With a corps of reporters in attendance, Elm Farm Ollie made aviation history as she became not only the first cow to fly, but also the first cow to be milked while aloft. The milk was sealed into paper containers and parachuted over St. Louis - proving that while it may be true that
