Pennsylvania Emu Farmers Form Association

MILLVILLE (Columbia Co.) — Members of a recently formed Pennsylvania Emu Farmers Association (PEFA) held a mail-ballot election of officers and announced that it intends to participate in the Eastern Emu Expo and Trade Show, set for May 12-13 at the Lancaster Host Resort, in Lancaster.

According to its president, Joanne Long, of Bloomsburg, the PEFA organization was created because of the large number of emu breeders within Pennsylvania.

She said that as the membership within the American Emu Association has continued to grow, it has further subdivided into affiliate chapters.

The AEA members of Pennsylvania, formerly with the Eastern Region of the AEA, are now automatically considered to be members of the PEFA. Through a mailing list of members, ballots were sent out and members elected officers.

In addition to Long, Michelle Henninger, of Shippensburg, was elected vice president; Kay Harmon, of Berwick, its secretary; and Patricia Russell-Souder, of Perkiomenville, was elected treasurer.

Long said that the organization's first board meeting was scheduled to be held today (Feb. 18), and part of the agenda would be to decide when and where to hold a first statewide meeting. She said she hoped that the statewide. meeting would be held in March.

The oranization helps members promote the emu before the general public, and provides a medium for fellowship and continued learning.

The organization has received preliminary approval to be an affiliate of the American Emu Association.

"Primarily, PEFA was formed to set up zoning within the state," said Joanne Long, president. "There will be eight zones, allowing members to hold local meetings, get to know each other on a more personal level, and share the latest industry information in a timely fashion."

Emus are being raised in 48 states in the United States as well as Canada. The AEA currently has more than 5,300 members.

According to the news release, "One of PEFA's goals is to educate the public about the many byproducts of the emu. Emu produce a red meat similar in texture and taste to beef, an oil which is currently being used in cosmetics, hides for leather products, as well as feathers, toenails, and green eggshells, which are used for a var-

iety of crafts and jewelry."

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
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
