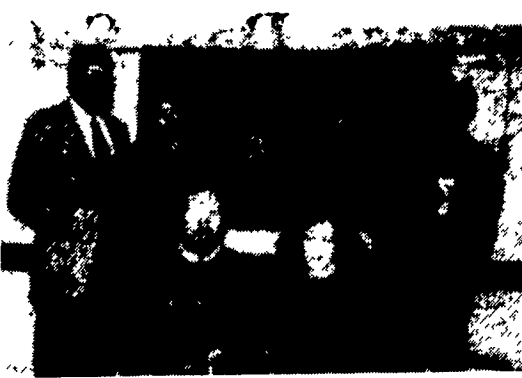


The state honorary young farmer is Terry Martin Sr. Grace Hoppes makes the presentation.

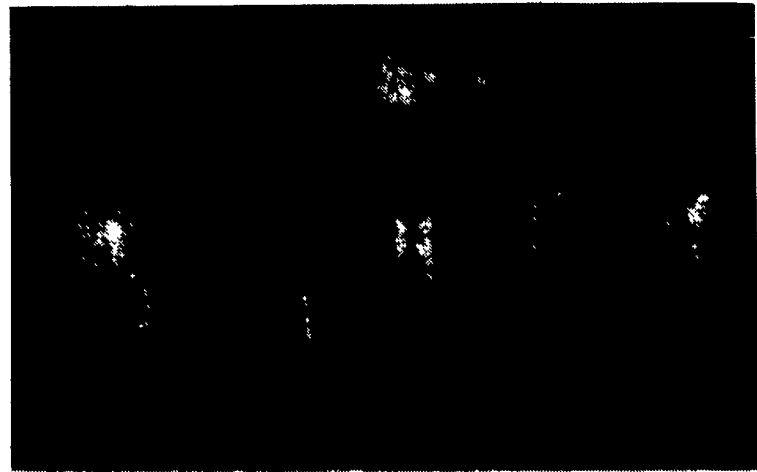

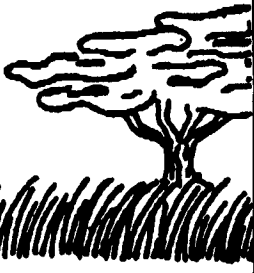
