DAILY NATIONAL GRAIN SUMMARY

WHEAT PRICES FAILED TO MOVE HIGHER, DESPITE GOOD EXPORT INTERESTS. A PICK UP IN FARMER SELLING THIS WEEK AND SLOW EXPORT DEMAND PUT PRESSURE IN CORN PITS. SOYBEAN PRICES WERE UNEVEN, BUT HIGHER SOYBEAN DEMAND AND FUND BUYING OFFERED SOME STRENGTH. WHEAT 2 TO 8 CENTS LOWER. CORN 1 TO 5 CENTS LOWER. SORGHUM MIXED. SOYBEANS MIXED. EXPORT SALES HAVE BEEN GOOD FOR WHEAT THIS WEEK, HOWEVER, FAVORABLE GROWING WEATHER IN WINTER WHEAT AREAS UNDERMINED PRICES. BENEFICIAL SNOWFALL MANY PLACES GAVE PROTECTION TO WHEAT AND PRICES FELL SLIGHTLY. CORN PRICES WERE MODERATELY LOWER IN RESPONSE TO SLOWED EXPORT DEMAND AND LAST WEEK'S CANCELLATION BY CHINA. FARMER SELLING HAS INCREASED LATELY AFTER RECENT PRICE GAINS. REPORTS OF PROBLEMS IN SOUTH AFRICA'S MAZE CROP LIMITED U.S. PRICE DECLINES. EXPORT SOYBEAN SALES ARE SCARCE SO FAR THIS WEEK BUT OIL DEMAND IS UP SOME, ADDING LIGHT SUPPORT TO PRICES. COMMERCIAL BUYING ON THE BOARD WAS FAIRLY HEAVY TODAY. UPCOMING HARVEST IN SOUTH AMERICA KEPT SOME PRESSURE ON BEAN PRICES. GRAINS INSPECTED FOR EXPORT FOR WEEK ENDED 2/9/95: WHEAT TOTALED 23.7 MILLION BUSHEL, CORN 50.0 UP 2.9, SORGHUM 3.5 DOWN 5.0, AND SOYBEANS 21.1 UP 2.9 MILLION BUSHEL COMPARED TO A WEEK AGO. YEAR TO DATE: WHEAT 828.0

DOWN 38.3, CORN 901.3 UP 210.6, SORGHUM 98.8 UP 28.4, AND SOYBEANS 448.6 UP 99.2. CROP MARKETING YEARS BEGIN JUNE 1 FOR WHEAT AND SEPTEMBER 1 FOR CORN, SORGHUM AND SOYBEANS.

Feeder cattle demand declined as the day progressed with closing action fair to moderate. Calf demand moderate to good. Quality average to mostly attractive. Feeder cattle flesh mostly moderate; calves slightly thin to slightly fleshy. Weigh-ups showed the complete range of gaunt to full, improving for the buyers towards the days end.
