FRENCH FARMER'S BAKED BEEF AND BARLEY

1 1/2 pounds stew beet 3 tablespoons oil 1 medium onion, chopped 5 cups beef stock 1/2 teaspoon thyme 1/2 teaspoon marjoram 1/4 teaspoon rosemary

1 cup barley 1 tablespoon chopped fresh parsley



rim all fat from beef and cut into 1/2-inch cubes. Heat oil in large skillet and sauté onion. Add beef and brown on all sides. Place onion and beef in 3-quart ungreased casserole. Combine stock, herbs, and barley in the skillet and bring to a boil. Pour stock mixture over the beef, cover, and bake for one hour. Garnish with parsley and serve with French bread.
