in the Delaware Army National Guard and was called to active duty in 1950. Following his military service, he graduated in 1954 from the University of Delaware with a Bachelor of Science Degree in Agriculture, with Distinction honors.

Active in the various segments of the dairy industry, Cook is a past president of She National Mastitis Council and the Maryland/DC Dairy Technology Society. He was vice-president of the National Conference of Interstate Milk Shippers and served on the

conference's Drug Residue Committee to develop a national drug reside control program for Grade A milk. Cook has also served on the National Milk Producers Federation's Interstate Milk Shippers Committee as a committee chair for the International Association of Milk, Food and Environmental Sanitarians, and been instrumental in development and direction of the Pennmarva Dairymen's Federation and Middle Atlantic Cooperative Milk Marketing Agency. He has been instrumental in working

with dairy producers and the legislature toward the formation of a Maryland Milk Commission.

Throughout his dairy industry career, Cook also remained active in military service, graduating in 1984 from the U.S. Army War College and from the U.S. Command and General Staff College in 1986. In 1987, Major General Cook assumed command of the 29th Infantry Division (Light), until his retirement in December 1993. The Major General Boyd M. Cook Armory at Fort Ritchie was

recently dedicated in his honor.

Cook is married to the former Patricia Chatty and the couple has five children and 11 grandchildren. He is a long-time lay leader and has served in various capacities at St. Mark's Episcopal Church, Hagerstown.

In honor of his years of service, Cook received numerous tributes

and gifts from Mid-America Dairymen and the division's employees and board of directors, Pennmarva Dairymen's Federation, milk processor customers and a hand-made Amish quilt from members of the cooperative's District 2 of Lancaster and Chester counties.

pearance and consolidation of the small family farm, Hallberg and Fallert stated, "At no time in the past has our government attempted to prevent a technology from being adopted on the basis of social factors. We see little reason for doing so now."

They added, to maintain farming communities "we should be directing more of the public's funds to rural development efforts which provide part-time or full-time offfarm work for farm families, rather than to efforts designed to prevent output-increasing and cost-reducing technological developments in food production."

On the issue of price support policy, Hallberg and Fallert stated "see no reason to expect rBST use to lead to greater accumulations of surpluses of dairy products in the long run, if present

policy is maintained. The present automatic adjustment of price supports in response to projected surpluses should be sufficient for the task."

For consumer education, Hallberg and Fallert suggested that some of the milk checkoff funds now used for dairy product promotion programs could be used to present rBST's known costs and benefits to the public.

Hallberg is editor of the book, "Bovine Somatotropin & Emerging Issues: An Assessment." Much of his past research has been concerned with national policy for the dairy industry. He has served on various national committees and Task Forces including the American Agricultural Economic Association Task Force on Dairy Marketing Orders.
