Granted we have not found any "sire proof guys" knocking at our door to buy our bulls but, we have found that many local farmers are interested in what we have. Another aspect that we find rewarding is when other farmers come and ask us what kind of bulls we are using. We see this as a compliment to our herd and our breeding program.

JUNIOR ACTIVITIES: Being involved in the Junior Holstein Association has proved to be rewarding to me. I have always believed that if you did not get involved in some activity you would be missing out on something. Since my first year in 4-H I have been involved on the Dairy Bowl team. Being involved in Dairy Bowl has taught me more about the dairy industry and how the Holstein breed developed than anything else.

Presently I am serving as vice president of the Pennsylvania Junior Holstein Association. I am also serving as co-chair for the ad that Pennsylvania Juniors are putting in the program book along with being on the committee for


