WHEAT PRICES CONTINUED TO DECLINE DUE TO OVERNIGHT EXPORT DISAPPOINTMENTS AND FAVORABLE WINTER WHEAT GROWING WEATHER. CORN AND SOYBEAN PRICES RECEIVED SUPPORT FROM LAST WEEK'S INCREASED EXPORT INSPECTION FIGURES. WHEAT 1 TO 8 CENTS LOWER. CORN 1 TO 2 CENTS HIGHER. SORGHUM MIXED. SOYBEANS 1 TO 5 CENTS HIGHER. USDA REJECTED EEP WHEAT TENDERS BY PAKISTAN AND 'ORDAN, PUSHING WHEAT PRICES MODERATELY LOWER. THE BEAUTIFUL SPRING LIKE WEATHER IN WINTER WHEAT GROWING AREAS HAS CROP LOOKING GOOD. CORN PRICES MOVED SLIGHTLY HIGHER, SUPPORTED BY A STRONG WEEKLY EXPORT INSPECTION REPORT AND TODAY'S EXPORT PURCHASE FROM TAIWAN. EXPORT INSPECTIONS WERE ALSO GOOD FOR SOYBEANS, HOWEVER, CONCERNS OVER THE POSSIBILITY OF REDUCED BEAN PLANTINGS THIS YEAR WAS THE MAJOR INFLUENCE FOR HIGHER BEAN PRICES.
