



government costs on the dairy program (which is already one of the lowest cost commodity programs); #2 return a fair price to dairy farmers; #3 take care of the nutrition programs; #4 make milk available for the export program; and #5 reimburse dairy farmers for mandated conservation and environmental programs.

The formula that we are using to accomplish the above will return an adequate price to dairy farmers on their investment, which they are presently being denied, plus the formula will return an adequate price to dairy farmers to cover their unpaid labor and living expenses which is not presently being covered adquately.

The formula will use defensible figures by the Commerce Department, the Bureau of Labor Statistics and figures from the U.S.D.A. Coupling these figures together dairy farmers can receive a pay price at least equal to the December 1989 price.

Some people will argue that our pricing formula reflects only the supply factor and does not consider the demand factor. Wrong.

The demand figure is taken into consideration by the percentage of utilization in each class of milk.

However, even more important is the supply management part of the bill that takes into consideration the total demand of dairy products by consumers.

Many unfavorable things may happen this year to dairy farmers and other commodity producers. It's up to the dairy farmers to decide which programs they support.
