Trade sentiment was generally steady. In the parts complex, breast items were fully adequate. Leg items were in fairly good balance. Wings were irregularly distributed, but adequate overall.

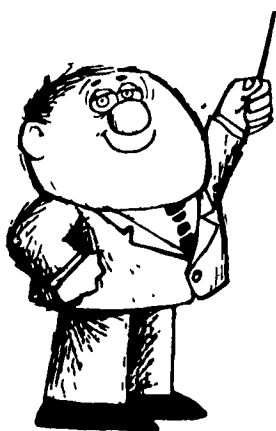
