DELMARVA BROILER/FRYER MARKET. FEDERAL-STATE

Movement of ready-to-cook whole birds remained light and unaggressive. Offerings were readily available and slow to clear particularly 3.5 to 4 pound sizes. Live supplies were moderate; weights were light to heavy, mostly desirable to heavy. Processor schedules were very heavy. Less than trucklot asking prices were 1 cent lower at 49 to 60 cents. Trade sentiment was weak and unsettled. Breast items were in heaviest supply, and were competitively priced to stimulate movement. Leg quarters were irregularly available, and in fairly good balance overall. Wings were adequate and cleared satisfactorily at most plants.

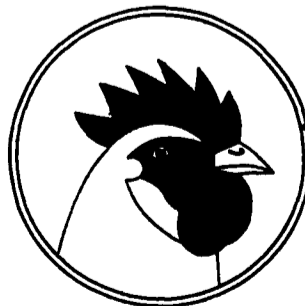
