Very good export demand for wheat and a lower U.S. dollar offered support to grain and soybean prices. Wheat 1 to 8 cents higher. Corn 1 to 4 cents higher. Sorghum 2 to 3 cents higher. Soybeans 3 to 8 cents higher. Long time coming but Bangladesh and Egypt are finally back. Substantial sales overnight by them as well as China and Japan gave wheat prices a boost. The U.S. dollar continued to fall against the yen to-day offering additional support to grain and bean prices. Corn and bean prices climbed higher due to fund buying on the board and spillover strength from wheat pits. Improved meal and oil demand also added strength to soybean prices.
