Wheat prices were slightly higher on export expectations and fund buying on the board. Corn prices were supported by improved export demand and lower corn

production estimates out of Africa. Soybean prices continued to decline on active bean harvest in Brazil. Wheat 2 to 6 cents higher. Corn unchanged to 3 cents higher. Sorghum unchanged to 2 cents lower. Soybeans 1 to 3 cents lower. Export sales, though steady, have been small this week for wheat. However, optimism for China to tender soon offered some support to wheat prices. Fund buying on the wheat board gave a boost to prices. Corn prices firmed by Taiwan's purchase but reports that Africa's corn production estimate was lowered to 4.33 million tonnes pushed prices moderately higher. Good progress made in Brazil's bean harvest continued to weight on U.S. bean prices. Light export interests limited price declines.
