### BRATTLEBORO, Vt. - The Ayrshire Breeders's Association has announced its 1994 All-American results and a new production goal for the breed to increase production annually by 3

# Cargill's Feed Division Plans For Lebanon Mill

LEBANON (Lebanon Co.)— Cargill's Feed Division announced that construction will begin soon on a new state-of-theart feed mill here.

Dave Larson, Feed Division president, said the facility will focus on the nutrition and service needs of the area's dairy producers and will also produce swine and other specialty feeds. The plant will produce both bagged and bulk feeds. Farm store products will be distributed from the

"We decided to locate a mill in Lebanon to better serve the needs of Pennsylvania's dairy farmers and other livestock-feed users,

Larson said. "This is Cargill's first mill in eastern Pennsylvania, an area which we believe is a highpotential, long-term market for the livestock industry." Cargill has been providing some service to the area through its mill in Walkersville, Md., Larson noted.

The facility will be located at the intersection of 16th and Lehman streets and will employ 10 to 15 people. The main structure at the Lebanon mill will be a tower seven to eight stories high. Other buildings will include a one-story office and warehouse. Construction is expected to be completed by the summer of 1996.
