Less than trucklot asking prices were unchanged at 42 to 53 cents. e. Top quality breast items were often noted as in closer balance. Wings were noted as more readily available, and

thighs were building at some points.

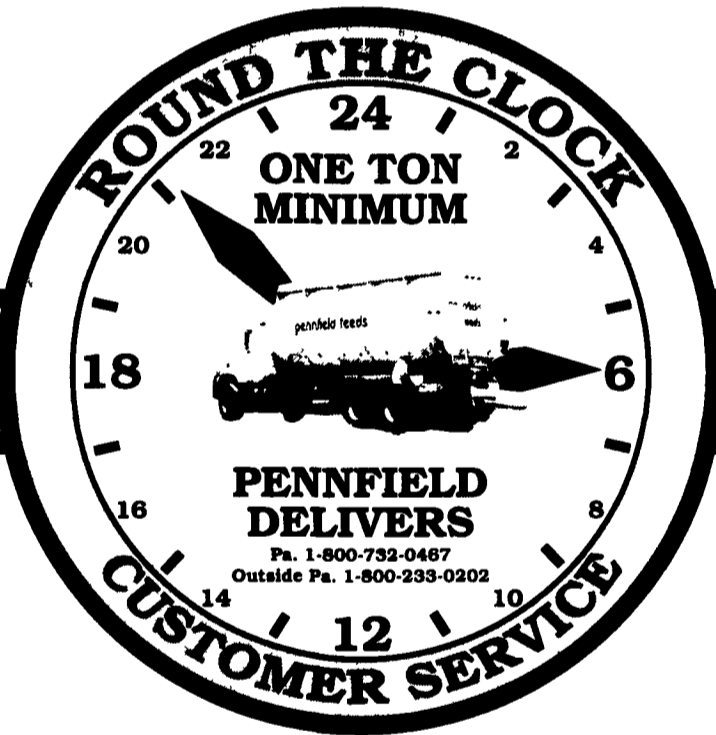
