Farms. "We're excited at the opportunity to have our genetics in other herds and hope they prove helpful to other breeders," says Steve of the bull that is presently the second-high-ranked Blackstar son at Landmark.

Some embryo transfer work continues at Penn Gate herd, though the Woods agree that sometimes records, such as the herd calving interval, suffers as a result. They do believe in selling animals in which other breeders have an interest and are extremely pleased when an individual performs well for their buyers.

"We love to milk our cows," smiles Chris, as Steve quips, "It's our payback for all the other things we do for them every day."

Since 1987, Penn Gate has received 48 All-Pennsylvania awards. Both Steve and Chris are in demand for show judging and have judged dairy shows in states throughout the region.

Steve has been Adams County's director to the state Holstein board, chaired the State Show committee and served on Program Development and Evaluation committees. Chris has served on the state Holstein's Youth Committee, along with holding various offices and committee chair positions at the local level.

As the 1995 Pennsylvania Holstein Distinguished Young Breeder winners, they will compete for the national award in June. That selection will be announced during the annual National Holstein Convention, which the Pennsylvania Holstein Association will host at Pittsburgh in late June.

# Two New Farmers' Markets To Open

farmers' market sales will have two new markets to consider in Harford County this season.

According to Bill Amoss of the Harford County Economic Development office, new markets are set up to go on Thursdays at the big Aberdeen Proving Grounds Complex and another new market for Saturday mornings at the Abingdon Wal-Mart.

Amoss is working with Tony Evans of the Maryland Department of Agriculture to organize the new markets, which will see the number of farmers' markets in Harford County go from one (at Bel Air) to three in 1995. The Bel Air market is sponsored by the Bel Air Jaycees and has proven to be a real success. It operates two days each week.

Preference for participants in the new Aberdeen and Abingdon

markets will be given to farmers and producers in Harford, Baltimore, and Cecil counties. However, all interested producers wishing to take part in "producer's only" markets are invited to apply. Amoss may be contacted at (410) 638-3059.
