offerings well cleared, particularly 2.5 to 3 pound sizes. Live supplies were moderate; weights were mixed in a full range, but were mostly desirable to heavy. Processing schedules were very heavy. Less than trucklot asking prices were 2 cents higher at 47 to 58 cents. Trade sentiment remained higher. In the parts complex, boneless skinless breasts varied from adequate to well cleared. Bone-in breasts were in short supply. Leg items were adequate to barely adequate. Wings were irregularly available, but adequate overall.

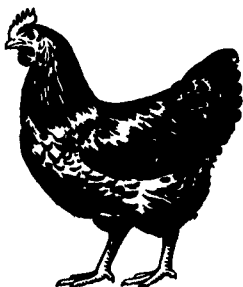
