

The Big Wind

nenerally, blustery spring days are a welcome sign of the season However, the wind becomes a damaging force at about 39 miles per hour. According to Beaufort's Scale of Wind Speeds (used by the National Weather Service) wind speeds of more than 75 mph are classified as a hurricane. Although extreme wind speeds in tornadoes and hurricanes have never been fully measured, they have been estimated at around 200 mph. One spring day the wind broke its own record On April 12, 1934, a gust of wind on Mount Washington in New Hampshire, was measured at 231 mph. It was "the strongest natural wind ever recorded on the earth's surface."




