Poultry Federation Banquet Wednesday In Hershey

HERSHEY (Dauphin Co.) — "A time for good friends and good food" sets the stage for the annual Pennsylvania Poultry Federation Fund Raising Banquet next Wednesday, April 19, here at the Hershey Convention Center.

More than 1,400 poultry producers and agri-business representatives, family, and friends will be on hand at the annual ban-

quet, which provides 75 percent of the Federation's annual operating budget.

"All you have to do is buy a ticket and have a good time," said John Hoffman, executive director of the Federation. Tickets are \$125 each.
