National DHIA Annual Meeting Focuses On Profiles

COLUMBUS, Ohio—The 72 delegates attending the 30th annual meeting of National DHIA, held March 27-28 in Burlington, Vt., heard from a number of progressive dairy producers and industry professionals, warning them to move forward aggressively in the development of new products and services.

Don Berg, vice president of the Milk Procurement/Membership Division of Land O'Lakes, encouraged the delegates to, "view the future aggressively," and summarized the coming changes in milk production, processing, and marketing strategies.

Don Rogers, vice president at Farm Credit, addressed specific areas of opportunity for DHIA, based on a stronger emphasis on the economic efficiency of the farm.

The Herd and Cow Profiles received the overwhelming approval of the National DHIA delegates. The Profiles are designed to provide an alternative to the enforcement-based Official DHI Rules program, and represent a major opportunity to strengthen the flow of production data throughout the dairy industry. Paul Knox, a New Hampshire producer well-known in genetic circles, referred to these Profiles as "a stroke of genius."

The delegate action clears the way for additional research, implementation, and field education necessary to support the Profiles program. Implementation is expected in 12-18 months.

An amendment to bring the program back to the delegates in 1996 failed, but some supporters of the amendment said this was

not a critical issue. Background materials have circulated through a number of channels, with additional information supplied as the program moves forward.

Dale Van Erden, a New York producer, presented a list of reasons why, "the future for the top producers will be very exciting."

The remainder of the program was driven by DHIA's interest in making these "top producer" strategies available to DHIA members nationwide. Eubert Correll, North Carolina, said the DHIA program needs to refine its pricing and service levels to better address all herd sizes and farming styles.

President Tom Sammon encouraged his fellow leaders to consider all available options in developing new services for their
