Farmers Research New Marketing Approaches

QUARRYVILLE (Lancaster Co.) — Marketing agricultural products in an increasingly competitive world is becoming a serious problem for the American farmer.

Faced with increasing competition from abroad, increasing operating costs for machinery, supplies, and equipment, and lower prices for most of the commodities produced, farmers across the nation must look for new ways to market their products. As traditional marketing avenues begin to lose some of their effectiveness, new ideas and marketing approaches are critically needed.

One such approach is currently making the rounds in farming circles. The idea is simple in conception and involves the bartering of processed agricultural products in the international market. With milk prices running below \$13 per hundred weight, the notion of bartering cheese, butter, evaporated and powdered milk on the international market for manufactured goods that can be sold in the United States for a higher price has attracted the attention of a number of Pennsylvania farmers.

On March 27, a group of about 50 interested Lancaster County farmers met at the Hoffman Building in Quarryville to discuss the possibility of producers' using a vertical integration strategy to improve the profitability of farming operations. Discussion included how the idea might be implemented, timeframes for doing so, and how the concept fits into established farm business procedures. Farmers at the meeting were unanimous in their feeling that this approach was worthy of additional study and approved the establishment of a commission to pursue the matter.

Among the reasons cited for moving in this direction was the desirability of marketing processed farm products in other countries such as the former Soviet Bloc, the Southeast Asia Trade Bloc. and South America where supply is lower and demand is higher. Traditional marketing techniques break down in those areas due to the lack of hard currencies. Bartering overcomes that barrier by accepting a marketable manufactured product rather than hard currencies.

At the initial meeting of the approved commission on April 10 at a farm in the Quarryville area, an organizational structure was established and a name was adopted.
