down, but more animals were consigned to the 16th annual Blue Halter Calf and Added Consignments Sale, held April 22 at the Bedford Fairgrounds in conjunction with the Pennsylvania Guernsey Breeders' Association annual awards banquet.

The sale offered more consignments in addition to the calves.

The total on 23 head sold as the Blue Halter Calf Sale was \$25,925, for an average of \$1,127.17. The seven head included in the "added consigments" sold for a total of \$10,025, for an average of \$1,432.14.

The highest selling animal was a senior calf consigned by Spring Walk Farm, of Big Prarie, Ohio, and purchased for \$2,600 by Troy Hill of Sandy Lake.

The second highest selling animal was also a senior calf, this one consigned by Harold Pyle, of Malvern, which was purchased by an unamed Kentuckian through Pa. Guernsey Association business manager Jim Trotter.

The Guernsey Gold Heifer Sale began in 1986 as a small sale of




select open heifers for junior members. Fifteen percent of the sale gross is to be set aside for the production contest.

All purchasers must be between ages 9 and 19 as of Jan. 1 prior to the sale, and only one may be purchased per consignent year. Heifers sold in 1995 are to then compete in the 1998 production contest.
