"Look for insults"

A transparent "Electronic Egg" that lights on impacts that might crack or break an egg is a useful tool. Run it through the entire collection and processing system to locate points that are providing more than their share of insults.

Sometimes cleaning or adjustment will eliminate or alleviate a trouble spot. But there will always be insults. Oyster shell is extra insurance that you'll have strong eggshells to help minimize the results of insults.

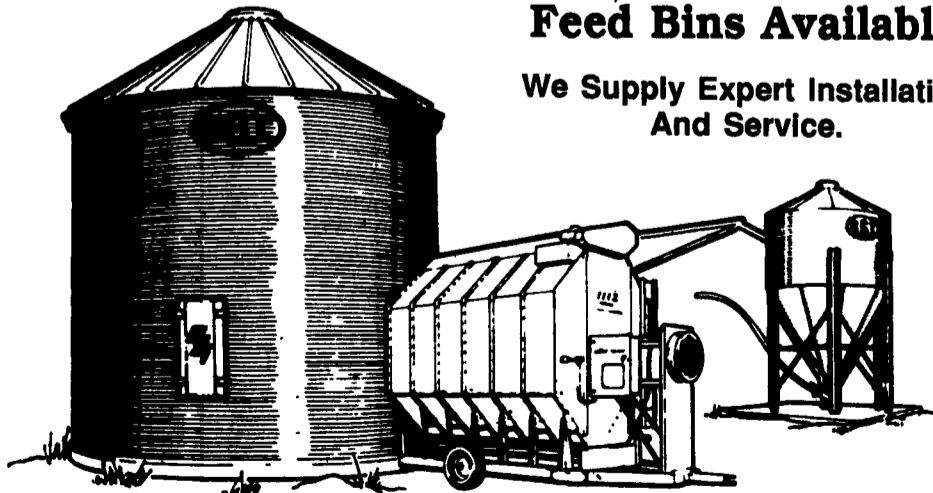
