

ANSWER — Brenda Seidel, Elliottsburg, wanted a recipe for French Apple Pie, which has raisins and is topped with icing. Thanks to Stan Kitchen, Dallas, for sending a recipe.

Pastry:
 French Apple Pie
 ½ cup butter
 1 cup sugar
 ½ cup flour
 1 teaspoon cinnamon
 ¼ teaspoon nutmeg

Fill an unbaked pie shell with sliced apples. Combine the butter, sugar, flour, and spices; blend with pastry blender. Pat on top of apples and bake at 450 degrees for 10 minutes. Lower oven temperature to 350 degrees and bake for about 40 minutes more.

Deep-dish apple pie with raisins. Peel, core, and slice five large McIntosh apples and arrange in well-buttered baking

dish. Mix together and pour the following on top of the apples:

¾ cup granulated sugar
 ¼ cup brown sugar
 ¼ teaspoon salt
 1 teaspoon cinnamon
 3 tablespoons tapioca
 ½ cup raisins

Pour one-half cup water over-all and dot generously with butter. Prepare pastry, using:

1 cup flour
 ½ cup shortening
 Pinch salt

Enough water to make a soft dough
 Roll out about ¼ -inch thick. Brush with cream. Sprinkle with sugar and prick with fork. Lay on top of apples. Bake in 400-degree oven for 40 minutes. Serve with cream.

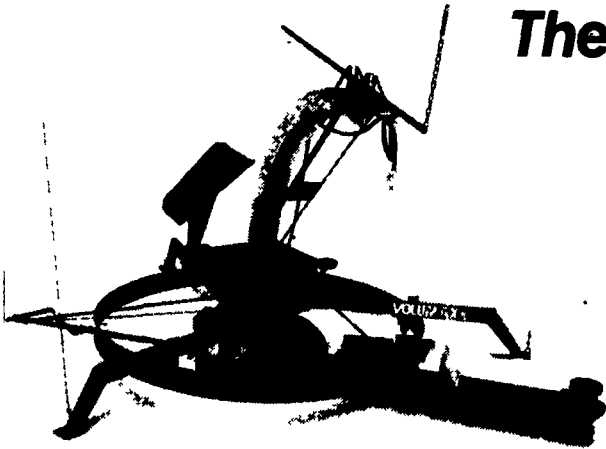

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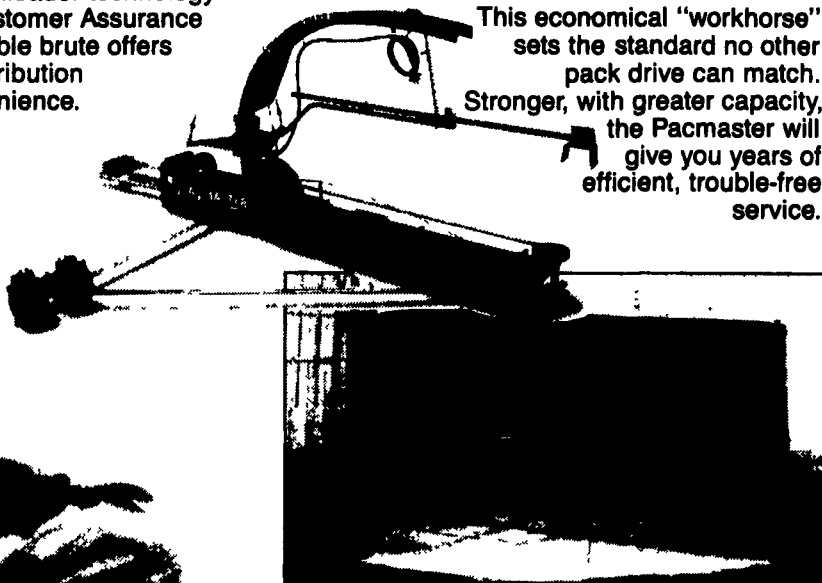


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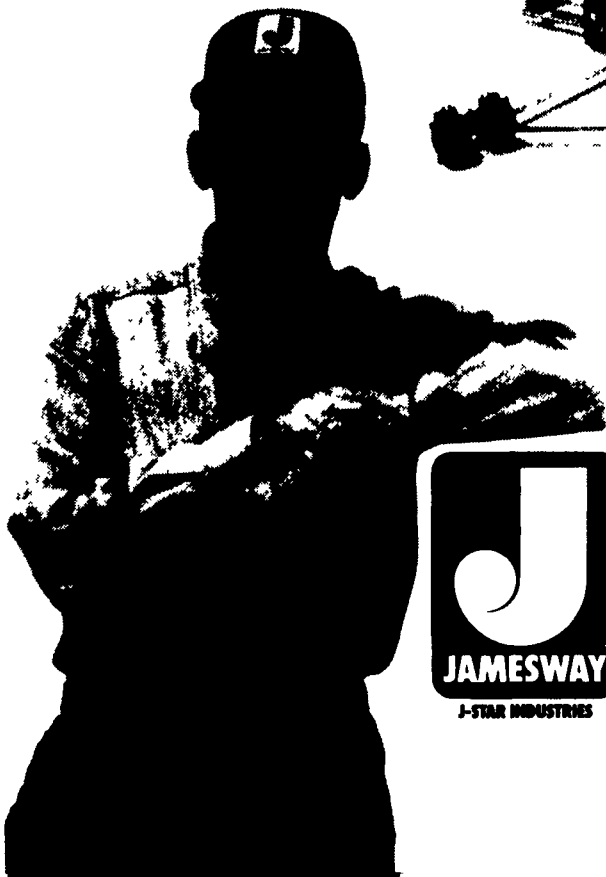
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
