Daily National Grain Summary
Wheat bids continued higher due to ongoing rains delayed planting in the Northern Plains states. Corn and bean traders backed off, however, in a corrective maneuver due to ideas recent gains have been

overdone and drier weather is in forecasts for Midwest areas by the weekend. Wheat 1 to 5 cents higher. Corn 3 to 5 cents lower. Sorghum 4 to 6 cents lower. Soybeans 3 to 9 cents lower. Wheat bids continued to receive support from rainfall in the Plains states and the delays in spring wheat seeding. Some weakness was noted, however, as export demand remains very slow this week and lower corn and bean bids knocked some strength out of wheat. Corn and bean bids declined as traders corrected recent upturns. Clearing weather has been forecast for the Midwest areas by this weekend and farmers are anxious to return to fields. However, many areas are very wet may take a while to dry enough to plant. Higher bids over the past couple of days have boosted farmer selling and weakened bids. Very good export demand for corn and beans this week, limited the declines.
