MOTHER'S DAY LETTERS

ilaria, an ancient spring festival to honor the mother goddess, Cybele, may have been the precusor to Mother's Day. Medieval England celebrated Mothering Sunday on the fourth Sunday of Lent, when apprentices got the day off to visit their mothers, often bringing an almond-flavored fruitcake. In the U.S., several late-19th century attempts to honor motherhood failed, until Anna M. Jarvis of Philadelphia began a letterwriting campaign, around 1907, and

got Mother's Day recognized at the state level. In 1914, President Woodrow Wilson issued the national proclamation. See

GREAT GRANDMOTHER'S SPONGE CAKE

- 2 cups sugar, divided 4 eggs
- 2 cups flour
- 2 teaspoons baking powder
- 2 teaspoons vanilla 1/4 teaspoon sait
- 1 cup hot milk
- 4 tablespoons melted butter
- n a large bowl,

beat together 1 cup sugar and 2 eggs until fluffy. Add remaining sugar and eggs, beating constantly. Sift together flour and baking powder three times, and

gradually add to mixture.

Add vanilla and salt. Stir

in hot milk and melted

butter. Pour into greased and floured 10-inch tube pan. Bake at 350° F for 40 to 45 minutes. Cool

on a rack. Makes about 12 servings.
