ANSWER - Jean Nestler, Halifax, wanted a recipe for Sally Lunn. Thanks to Susanna Bicher, Bethel; Carol Pretz, Middleburg; and others for sending a recipe for this old-fashioned bread. To envison the flavor of the era when this bread was served, Carol writes that Sally Lunn is a yeast bread that originated in Bath, England, where it was served hot with jam and butter. Thackery described a meal of "green tea, scandel, hot Sally Lunns, and a little novel reading."

- 2 cups milk
- 1 cup shortening
- 1½ yeast cakes
- 3 eggs, beaten
- 4 tablespoons sugar
- 2 teaspoons sait
- 6 cups flour


Scald milk, add sugar, salt, and shortening. Cool to lukewarm and crumble in yeast. Stir in beaten eggs. Add flour and beat thoroughly. Cover and let rise until doubled in bulk. Place in a Sally Lunn ring mold or tubular pan. Let rise again until doubled in bulk. Bake at 350 degrees for one hour. Yields 16 large servings.

ANSWER - Louise Graybeal, Renick, W.Va., wanted a recipe for pancake syrup that is light in calories. Thanks to Gracie Troutman, Halifax, for sending a recipe.

Homemade Syrup

1/2 cup packed brown sugar OR 2 tablespoons brown sugar plus 1/2 teaspoon Sweet n' Low Brown 1 teaspoon cornstarch 1/4 teaspoon cinnamon 1/2 cup plus 2 tablespoons skim milk 1 tablespoon liquid Butter Buds 1/2 teaspoon maple or vanilla flavoring Combine sugar, cornstarch, and cinnamon in a small saucepan, stirring constantly. Remove from heat; add liquid Butter Buds and flavoring, stirring until mixed. Serve warm. 2 tablespoons per serving = 35 calories or 22<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> is Sweet and Low is used; 0 fat. Variation: Warm Apple Topping % cup sliced green apples ¼ cup orange juice 1/4 teaspoon nutmeg 2 teaspoons brown sugar ¼ teaspoon almond extract Bring to a boil: apples, orange juice, and nutmeg. Cover and simmer for 5 minutes. Remove from heat and mash apples until smooth. Stir in sugar and almond extract. 2 tablespoons per serving = 14 calories, 0 from fat.
