York County Holds Ag Skills Day

More than 200 York County Agriculture Education students recently participated in the Annual York County Ag Skills Assessment Day activities held at Dover Area High School.

The students represented Dover, Eastern, Kennard-Dale, Northern, and Red Lion and selected from these seven different events: agronomy, ag mechanics, ag sales, dairy foods, forestry, land, or wildlife.

The winner of the agronomy contest was Lester Baney, a student at Dover Area High School. Lester correctly identified weed, crop, and insect samples and made accurate agronomic recommendations from the Penn State Agronomy Guide. Cale Leiphart from Eastern York and Angela Gable from Dover Area placed second and third, respectively.

The ag mechanics contest was conducted in two sessions with the morning session testing student skills in engines, electric motors, building construction, and cost and tool sharpening and fitting. The afternoon session tested electricity, plumbing, and machine operation.

Curt Ross of Dover High School received first place in the morning session and Nathan Hersey of Kennard-Dale placed first in the second session. Chad Garrett from Dover and Jim Farrell

from Kennard-Dale placed second and third in the morning session, and Scott Zellers and Chad Garrett from Dover Area placed second and third in the afternoon session.

The 1995 YCASA day winner in ag sales was Kristi Ryder of Dover High School. Kristi excelled in product knowledge, sales techniques, and product presentation. Following her in the awards ranking were Drew Bankert. Red Lion, and Regina Shelton, Red

At Pinchot Park, Carrie May of Northern correctly identified species of trees in the forestry contest. Joining Carrie from Northern with second and third place finishes were Share Lehman and Shane Albert.

Pinchot Park was also the site for the wildlife contest, where students were required to identify: birds and mammals and bird calls. Additionally, students needed to identify wildlife foods, wildlife signs, animal tracks, and evaluate wildlife habitat sites. With the assistance of the Pennsylvania Game Commission, results were first place, Lucas Wolf from Eastem York; second place, Jed Smyser from Dover; and third place, Jesse Greenwood from Eastern York.

The dairy foods contest required students to correctly identify off-flavors in milk samples, identify cheese samples, and correctly distinguish between real and artificial dairy products. Rick Ridgeway, quality control manager for Rutters Dairy served as official judge and prepared the milk samples for this year's event. Laurie Bish from Dover Area High School out-placed the other 50 contestants to win this event. Joanna Newcomer, also from Dover, placed second. Stacey Badger from Northern York placed third.

Lester Baney (double winner first place in agronomy, too) from Dover was top land judge in the event in which students evaluated soil characteristics, land capability? classes, and conservation practices. This event was held on the Smysers RichLawn Farm with assistance from the Soil Conservation Service. Places second through fifth were Jed Smyser, Dover; Jeff Metzler, Northern; Cale Leiphart, Eastern; and Marc Laflamme, Dover.


