Farm Survey Set For June

HARRISBURG (Dauphin Co.)—National Association of State Departments of Agriculture (NASDA) enumerators will contact approximately 2,400 Pennsylvania farmers during the first half of June to ask them to take part in a nationwide survey of American agriculture.

As the primary source of agricultural information for NASS data, this survey is one of the largest and most important conducted by the U.S. Department of Agriculture's National Agricultural Statistics Service (NASS).

The resulting information will be used to make reliable state, regional, and national estimates of crop acreage, grain stocks, and hog inventories. The Pennsylvania Agricultural Statistics Service (PASS) in Harrisburg is handling the Pennsylvania portion of the survey.

This June survey is particularly vital. It will provide the first clear indications of the potential production of major crops throughout the state.

Producers themselves rely on the data to reach valid production,

marketing, and investment decisions. Congresspersons and regulators use the information to produce better regulations and farm programs.

Industry analysts, extension agents, farm organizations, and agricultural lenders need the information to better serve and advise farmers and enable them to make decisions for both short and long range planning of their crop and/or livestock operations.

It is therefore important for Pennsylvania farmers to participate in the survey to ensure that local agriculture is accurately portrayed. Most producers selected for interviews will soon be notified by mail.

"We safeguard the confidentiality of all survey responses," Wally Evans, state statistician, said. "Data about individual operations are used only in conjunction with information from other producers."

Participants may receive summarized survey results for Pennsylvania and the nation upon request.

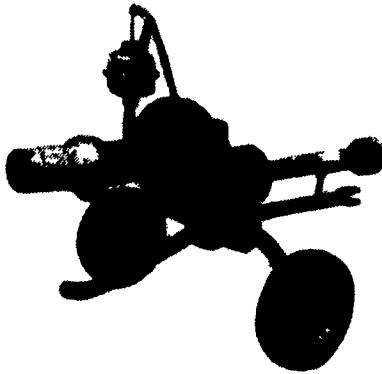
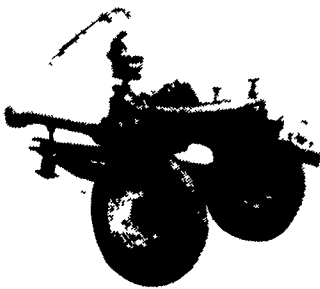
