Demand continued to center on immediate needs, and plants filled previously booked orders. Floor stocks were at least adequate. Shell egg supplies were generally adequate, and breaking stock prices were steady. Liquid and frozen eggs processed under federal inspection in the eastern region for the week ending May 20, 1995 were 1% less than last week, and 13% more than the same week a year ago.

MARKET COMMENT: THE MARKET TONE WAS NO MORE THAN STEADY, AND THE LIGHT SIZES WERE BARELY STEADY TO WEAK. DEMAND WAS LIGHT TO INSTANCES GOOD, BEST WHERE FEATURED AND INTO FOOD SERVICE CHANNELS, AND MOSTLY FAIR OVERALL. SUPPLIES OF LARGE SIZES WERE ADEQUATE OR AVAILABLE, AND MEDIUMS AND SMALLS WERE ADEQUATE TO AMPLE WITH SMALLS STILL TRADED FOR EXPORT. BREAKING STOCK SUPPLIES WERE ADEQUATE FOR THE MINIMAL DEMAND AS MOST PLANTS HAD ADEQUATE SUPPLIES FROM REGULAR SOURCES. A EXTRA LARGE .61-.63, LARGE .59-.61, MEDIUM .50-.53.

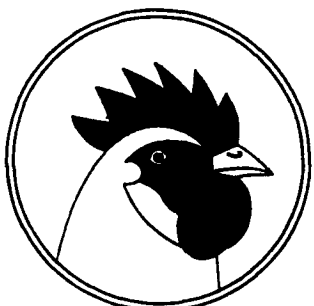
