National FFA Winners to Tour Europe, Gain International Perspective on Agriculture

For their achievements as national award winners, 35 FFA members from across the United States will be traveling to Europe for a 13-day seminar.

The award winners, announced last November in Kansas City, Mo., during the 67th National FFA Convention, will be leaving the Washington, D.C., area on June 18. Highlights of the tour include stops in Germany, Belgium and Luxembourg.

During the seminar, the students will observe typical agricultural practices in Eastern and Western Europe. As a part of their European cultural experience, the FFA members will:

- Visit agricultural cooperatives (collective farms) in Germany.
- Explore the city of Berlin.
- Receive a briefing on German agriculture by a member of the Ministry of Food, Agriculture and Forestry.
- Take a cruise on the Rhine River.
- Stay with a host family at Grossenhain, Germany (formerly East Germany).
- Receive a briefing from officials of the European Commission on GATT in Brussels.
- Visit a breeder of the well known double-muscled "Belgium White-Blue" cattle.
- Visit the American cemetery in Luxembourg where General Patton is buried.
- Visit the Paffendorf Castle to observe the restorations of farm land following open-pit mining.

Remove Refrigerator Odors

To remove odor from your refrigerator or freezer, follow the manufacturer's instructions for care or use general cleaning procedures as follows:

Wash the inside of the cabinet with detergent and water. Rinse with a clean cloth and clear water, and wipe dry. The plastic gasket which seals the door is likely to hold odors. Wash it thoroughly, rinse and dry carefully.

If odor remains, wash with a solution of 1 teaspoon baking soda for each quart of warm water.

In addition to the old standby of baking soda, activated charcoal will soak up persistent odors. Spread about 3 ounces of the fine powdered charcoal on a sheet of aluminum foil or in a shallow pan. Place on refrigerator or freezer

shelf. Foods can remain in the refrigerator with the charcoal.

After 6 to 8 hours, put the pan of charcoal in a moderate 350 degree oven for 20 minutes. This will reactivate the charcoal so it can be re-used many times. Put the charcoal back in the refrigerator. Repeat the process until the odor disappears.

Activated charcoal can be purchased at aquarium supply stores, agricultural supply stores, or at a pharmacy; prices vary greatly according to source with the aquarium supply store generally being the least expensive.

Chlorophyll cat litter also absorbs odors. Put the cat litter in about a 1/2 inch layer in a shallow pan and place in the refrigerator or freezer.
