

Delaware Re-Establishes Extension Advisory

NEWARK, Del. — Delaware Cooperative Extension relies on volunteers to help extend outreach programs to the public.

Now another volunteer group — the State Advisory Council — will help Dr. Richard E. Fowler, director of Delaware Cooperative Extension, and Dr. John C. Nye, dean of the College of Agricultural Sciences at the University of Delaware, promote extension programs on agriculture, youth development at the University of Delaware, food and gardening education and family support to Delaware's citizens and decision makers.

"We had an extension state advisory group up until four years ago, when we initiated the University of Delaware's Visiting Com-

mittee on Agriculture," said Fowler. "The visiting committee's direction is more university research and education-oriented, which is indispensable to our success. But another segment of our population — program leaders and volunteers at the local level with their direct knowledge of grassroots issues — had a contribution to make as well."

State agricultural leaders and extension volunteers throughout Delaware encouraged Fowler and Nye to reestablish the State Advisory Council to complement both the university's and extension's goals.

"Because these volunteers are directly involved in extension outreach, they are invaluable in advancing our programs," said Fowler. "They know from first-

hand experience the positive results Extension programming has on the citizens of Delaware."

Twelve representatives of the 16-member State Advisory Council were drawn from county advisory committees, which are made up of 4-H leaders, agricultural leaders, Master Gardeners, Master Foods Educators, and Master Financial Counselors. The remaining four representatives were selected at-large.

Simmental Juniors Face Busy Summer

BOZEMAN, Mont.—Junior members of the American Simmental Association (ASA) are looking forward to a summer filled with enjoyable, beef industry-related competition.

Five regional classics, during the month of June, followed by National Summer Classic XV in July, are on the upcoming calendar of events.

Regional classics, patterned after the National Classic, are planned at five wide-ranging locations. "There is a regional event within easy driving distance of 90 percent of our membership," said Mark Dikeman, American Junior Simmental Association (AJSA) president from Manhattan, Kan.

"Regional classics are a great place to become involved and to get warmed up for the National," Dikeman said. "We urge our members to prepare for the National Classic by studying and working at home, and by attending

one or more regional classics."

Regional classics are scheduled as follows: northcentral region, June 13-15, Des Moines, Iowa; eastern region, June 18-21, Bowling Green, Ky.; southeastern region, June 22-24, Perry, Ga.; southcentral region, June 23-25, Shreveport, La.; and western region, June 25-27, Twin Falls, Idaho.

Summer Classic XV, traditionally the highlight of the AJSA year, will be held July 17-21 at Rochester, Minn. ASA staff members are working closely with the Minnesota Simmental Association (MSA) membership and University of Minnesota Animal Science staff to coordinate that event.

Rochester's Kahler Hotel serves as Classic Headquarters, with all cattle activities at the Olmsted County Fairgrounds.

An estimated 250 AJSA members are expected to participate in junior and senior divisions. Com-

petition is held in a variety of cattle-related categories, including a herdsman's quiz; sire summary quiz; beef bowl; public speaking; sales talk; heifer exhibition (both Simmental and Simbrah breeds); showmanship; advertising and promotion; and interviewing.

Extracurricular activities on the schedule include two dances, a volleyball tournament, a barbecue cook-out, and a festive awards banquet.

Also, The Pennsylvania Simmental Association will once again hold the Pennsylvania Capitol Futurity in conjunction with the Keystone International Livestock Expo in October 1995.
