Animal Health Product Sales Top \$3 Billion

ALEXANDRIA, Va.—Total sales of U.S. animal health products were estimated to be \$3.1 billion in 1994, representing a 10 percent increase from the 1993 figure of \$2.8 billion. These figures were projected by the Animal Health Institute as part of its 1994 Domestic Net Sales Survey.

AHI represents manufacturers of animal health products-the pharmaceuticals, vaccines, and feed additives used in modern food production, and the medicines that keep pets healthy.

AHI conducts its sales survey annually. Sales are reported in three major products categoriespharmaceuticals, feed additives. and biologicals.

Sales totals for the United States are based on projections made by AHI's Market Research Committee using sales data AHI collected from its member companies. Sales are for products priced at the manufacturer's level.

A summary of the sales data in the three major product categories

•Pharmaceuticals: Pharmaceutical sales increased by 11 percent in 1994. Projected sales in this category for 1994 were \$1,936.5 million and the 1993 total was \$1,738 million. This product category covers the sales of dosage form medicines and other pharmaceutical preparations used in disease prevention and treatment programs for both foodproducing animals and pets.

•Feed Additives: Feed additive sales increased approximately 12.5 percent in 1994, with projected sales of \$667.7 million. 1993 sales were \$593.3 million. This category includes sales for all feed additives-with the exception of nutritionals—used in livestock and poultry production, including those used to control or prevent disease, enhance growth, or improve feed efficiency.

•Biologicals: Sales in this category increased approximately 1.5 percent in 1994, with projected sales of \$466.5 million. In 1993, this figure was \$458.9 million. This product category covers the sales of products used to create immunity to disease in both livestock and pets. Biologicals include vaccines, bacterins, and antitoxins licensed by the U.S. Department of Agriculture's Animal and Plant Health Inspection Service.

In collecting data for the 1994 Domestic Net Sales Survey, it was necessary for AHI to revise previously published 1993 survey data to more accurately reflect the 1993 market.


